JOUR POLICY

K-12 AANHPI CURRICULUM PROJECT

The K-12 AANHPI Curriculum Project advocates for the inclusion of Asian American, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander curriculum in our nation's classrooms.

In 2022, we accomplished:

- 60+ new lesson plans that are diverse, equitable, and inclusive in their treatment of AANHPI history. We also reached out to numerous other organizations to include their lesson plans in our database, so we can have one centralized hub where educators can go for AANHPI curriculum.
- Teacher Focus Groups
 - Launched a series of teacher focus groups that vetted the 60+ lesson plans throughout April and May. Their feedback has been incorporated into finalizing the lesson plans for the database.
- Workshop Launch in May
 - A 90-minute workshop featuring a panel of educators/advocates that discussed the importance of including AANHPI studies in K-12 education and a teach-in to demonstrate ways to incorporate lessons in K-12 classrooms

AAPI DIGITAL ACCESS SURVEY

Internet access has become a civil rights issue. OCA wants to advocate for digital equity by listening to our AAPI communities. Specifically, we want to understand where and how AAPIs have internet access so that we can identify the diverse needs and challenges they face.













Regions of Chapter Internship Grant Interns










IMAGE MAGAZINE



WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE MEMORY OR EVENT THAT YOU HOSTED WITH YOUR CHAPTER?

"The most favorite event the central Virginia Chapter hosted in 2022 was the "Fall Picnic". Before COVID, our chapter used to host a fall picnic every year. But when COVID hit, all major events were suspended or went online. So last October, we hosted our first fall picnic since the pandemic. It was very successful. Many families came out and enjoyed the food and reconnected. Children played games and had a lot of fun. It was a great experience to get our community together and ease some of the pandemic anxiety."

"OCA Greater Tucson's favorite 2022 memory is the first program with Tucson Unified School District (TUSD) presenting Arizona AANHPI cultural history and introducing the 48 teaching modules developed by OCA and partners. The audience of 45 teachers and administrators of community student services programs planned to use the resources for their lesson plans. Our overall goal was to gain support for the bill to mandate AANHPI curriculum in K-12. The bill passed the House but fell in the Senate. We continued with new presentations in March, 2023, and plan for more opportunities with TUSD the rest of the year."

"The year 2022 marked the 50th-anniversary milestone of The Association of Chinese Americans (OCA – Detroit Chapter), which organized the "Justice for All" Art Event to commemorate Vincent Chin's 40th Anniversary, teamed with Ford Motor to distribute winter clothes to the needy and celebrated at our 50th Anniversary Gala with over 200 participants including many past presidents, and many more."

"It's so hard to pick only one memory to share. There's always so much going on. One event that comes to mind is our 2022 Legislative Reception held at the Leland Stanford Mansion, a property once owned by former California Governor Leland Stanford and his wife. This event was well-planned and was the first project co-lead by our VP of Advocacy, Keaton Riley, and Executive Vice President, Greg Jung.

The purpose of this event is to build a bridge between community members and elected officials. Community members mix, mingle, and hear what each official has on their list of priorities for the year. We had over 180 attendees the day of the event, not including board members, our board's family members, and elected officials. There was so much interest that we closed online registration the day before.

This was our first public event since we stopped large events due to COVID-19, and it was great seeing people again and sharing good food. This event also took place the week OCA Sacramento returned from the National Convention in Las Vegas, which provided us an opportunity to celebrate our awards and recognition with those in attendance."

And we're doing it again this year, this time with 54 restaurants/food trucks! So exciting!"
